Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention (CBVIP)

Agency-Specific:

ICJIA's CBVIP programs collaborate with service providers, local government agencies, law enforcement personnel, and other stakeholders to prevent community violence.

Funding:

- Illinois (ICJIA) is one of four states to be awarded a first-ofits-kind BJA grant, securing \$2.5M for CVIPI programming.
- ICJIA's Violence Prevention, Intervention, and Reduction programs represent ~ 41% of the FY 2024 budget.



Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention (CBVIP)

Technical Assistance Resources:

- ICJIA collaborates with Illinois lawmakers to offer training and assistance to constituents in high-need areas.
- Local agencies are encouraged to participate in GATA webinars, Recipe for Success training, and Institute to Innovate (i2i).



Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention (CBVIP)

Innovation:

- (i2i) is ICJIA's capacity-building arm, providing emerging organizations with a comprehensive strategic planning, budgeting, collaborative relationship development, and grant application curriculum.
- ICJIA co-leads the Government Alliance for Safer Communities (GASC), a public-private partnership that prevents violence by offering holistic services to highneeds communities.



DCJS Office of Youth Justice

DCJS Office of Youth Justice (OYJ) provides resources and expertise to promote positive change and improve the quality and responsiveness of the justice system on behalf of youth and families.

OYJ's goal is to provide a fair and equitable justice system that gives youth an opportunity to reach their full potential and prevents future system involvement, with emphasis on cross system collaboration to achieve progress. Our work is underscored by promoting healing and moving on the path to justice, which removes systemic barriers to advancement and success for all.



SNUG Overview

- SNUG utilizes a public health approach to address gun violence by identifying the source, interrupting the transmission, and changing group norms.
- Comprehensive state oversight allows for the program to be delivered consistently across the 14
 communities served by the program, even though a local nonprofit organization administers the state
 and federal grant funding in those communities.
- New York's SNUG Street Outreach program is unique from others that operate in the state and communities across the country because of its strong state oversight, administration, technical assistance, and training.
- The state-specific model has comprehensive policies and protocols related to hiring, identifying highrisk participants, interacting with police, and the use of data to identify neighborhoods served by the program.
- The program also embeds social workers and case managers at SNUG sites and hospitals to assist
 individuals and families who don't often identify as victims, have trauma resulting from long-term
 exposure to violence, and may be skeptical or hesitant to seek counseling and case management
 support.


Pennsylvania Commission on Crime & Delinquency (PCCD) Statewide Community of Practice technical assistance, training, and capacitybuilding initiative




