The Violent Crime Reduction Online Self-Assessment Tool is now available for all law enforcement agencies! The purpose of this self-assessment tool is to help the responding agency identify areas in which it might want to increase its violent crime reduction capacities and capabilities. This tool leverages the knowledge and information captured in the Major Cities Chiefs Association's Violent Crime Reduction Operations Guide, AEquitas's companion Prosecutors' Guide for Reducing Violence and Building Safer Communities, and the lessons learned through the National Public Safety Partnership (PSP) and other Bureau of Justice Assistance training and technical assistance (TTA) programs.

The tool is meant to help an agency identify a continuum of capacity and serve as a means for that agency to identify for itself areas in which it may want to improve and build capacity.
